3 New Drugs Approved by the FDA!

A message from Sue Enright, Midwest Regional Director for the IMF ...

If you are a subscriber to the IMF's weekly electronic newsletter "*Myeloma Minute*" you will have already received information about the 3 new drugs for Myeloma treatment. Daratumumab (trade name Darzalex) has been approved by the FDA. The International Myeloma Foundation (IMF) applauds the <u>approval</u> of Ninlaro (ixazomib), an oral, once-weekly proteasome inhibitor, for use in combination with lenalidomide and dexamethasone to treat people with multiple myeloma who have received at least one prior therapy. And Empliciti (elotuzumab), a monoclonal antibody developed by Bristol-Myers Squibb and AbbVie, for use in combination with lenalidomide and dexamethasone to treat multiple myeloma patients who have received at least one prior therapy has also been approved. <u>The Trillium Fund</u> was established in 1982 by an anonymous donor to support multiple myeloma research at the UW Carbone Cancer Center. 100% of your gift to this fund will be used for multiple myeloma research. To date almost \$1.5 million has been raised. Your gift is used to collect the necessary data to apply for large federal, other public and private grants that support MM research. It is estimated that for every \$1 invested in the Trillium Fund \$12 more dollars are generated. The Trillium Fund has had a profound impact on multiple myeloma research at the UW Carbone Cancer Center. It currently supports the work of several scientists, physicians, graduate and undergraduate students connected through the UW Carbone Cancer Center to focus on finding better treatments and ultimately a cure for multiple myeloma. The program has grown from a small research study and patient base to a program helping over 200 patients across Wisconsin and Illinois receive world class care. Donors to the Trillium Fund are invited to an update every couple of years. At the last update in 2014 we had over 70 guests. Dr. Natalie Callander leads the update and her team leaders present their studies. It is an amazing presentation. They share what they are learning in the labs and how it is translating their research into better treatments.
