Support Young Researchers at the NIH

On September 9th, Senator Tammy Baldwin (D-WI) introduced S. 2014, The Next Generation Researchers Act. The goal of this legislation is to create more opportunities for young, emerging researchers and to make it easier for them to receive grants for their work. It is already difficult for the newest generation of researchers to get grants, and the decline in NIH funding has made it even harder. Previously, talented researchers from around the world who once flocked to the US to pursue training and stayed for our innovation driven economy, are now returning to better opportunities in their home countries. The impact of losing a generation of investigators and medical innovators will have repercussions. S. 2014 will remedy this problem by creating the Next Generation Researchers Initiative at the NIH. It will direct the NIH to coordinate policies and programs with the goal of increasing opportunities for young researchers and promoting earlier research independence. **Please take a moment to ask you Senators to support S.2014!
