November IMF Advocacy Update: Federal Legislative Efforts

The Cancer Drug Coverage Parity Act is still advancing in both the House and the Senate. The House bill, HR 2739, added nine new cosponsors during the recess break Reps. Bilirakis (R-FL), Delaney (D-MD), Palazzo (R-MS), Carney (D-DE), Olson (R-TX), Garamendi (D-CA), Cummings (D-MD), Heck (R-NV), and Peters (D-CA). This brings the total number of cosponsors to 116. The IMF's Patients Equal Access Coalition (PEAC) is pleased with the progress they have had thus far in bringing on support for the federal legislation. In the coming months PEAC will be discussing strategy moving into 2017. As more progress is made, the advocacy team will be sure to share their advancements.
